I have enjoyed hearing all the stories from school - so I will try and give you a synopsis of what I've been up to since matriculating in 1962 [if I can remember that far back!]

After Matriculating I went to medical school at Wits from 1963 to 69 and then completed my intern year in 1970 at the JHB general hospital. I am a Professor in the Dept. of Surgery at the University of Washington School of Medicine and hold an Endowed Chair and Professorship in Craniofacial surgery at the Children's Hospital and the University of Washington.

Whilst working I am very active in clinical care, surgery, teaching and research and travel regularly to Africa with other members of our team to help set up multidisciplinary Cleft and Craniofacial centers there. We run these mainly out of Ghana, Nigeria and Ethiopia and have satellite centers in Tanzania, Ivory Coast and elsewhere.



On the personal side I am still married to my wife Eve [who I met as an Intern] and we are coming up for 40 years in 2014. I have one daughter Jennie who is an Interior Designer in Seattle. My wife is very dedicated to Animal Rescue and we have 4 rescue dogs and a cat.
