Schwartz: - Venables' predecessor - who taught with some passion.

Cullen: an awful teacher who sexually harassed the girls and glared at me for 5 years after I did an end of year skit on him in Form 1 (fool that I was).

Harrison: inspired respect; I had him as a principal for 12 years and in all that time he hardly spoke a word to me. I was pleased to see him years later attending a rally for Robert Kennedy on the Wits campus.

Lorna Gordon: moved me - caught up with her afterwards in the UK. When she laughed the sun shone.

Lynsky: inspired me – left me with a feeling for Afrikaans literature believe it or not [The last two were the only 2 teachers who turned me on]
